Changes indicated by shaded text

Type of assessment	Weighting
Investigation Students plan and conduct research and communicate their findings. Evidence can include: expedition manuals or journals, diaries, essays, reports, stories, oral and/or video presentations.	15%
Performance 1: specific to outdoor adventure activity skills and strategies Students develop and refine skills and strategies used in an outdoor adventure activity. Evidence is collected over a period of time and can include: checklists/rubrics, direct observation and video.	50%
Response Students analyse and respond to stimuli or prompts. Evidence can include: reflections, logbooks, journals, tests, summaries and/or essays.	20%
Externally set task A written task or item or set of items of 50 minutes duration developed by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority and administered by the school.	15%
